MESSAGE FROM THE NATIONAL PRESIDENT - FIJI MUSLIM LEAGUE



Allah (SWT) has bestowed us with abundant blessings amongst which are the provisions of education and in particular Islamic educational institutions.

Education is the basis of all progress. The entire purpose of education is not to restrict itself to imparting bookish knowledge only but inculcate human values like wisdom, compassion, courage, humility, integrity and reliability in a student.

2023 is an important year which marks 97 years of inception. Despite all odds we have successfully managed to develop a progressive organisation, ready to meet the challenges in a developing Nation. The vision, mission, perseverance, dedication, sacrifices and aspirations of our forefathers is praiseworthy

The pioneer members of the Fiji Muslim League with very little or no formal education had to cope with numerous challenges, however, they were persistent with their objective to establish educational institutions for the betterment of coming generations in key Centres, which have become a hive for all our activities.

Their focus was to have an educated society which would contribute in different spheres of our beloved country.

Our first school, Suva Muslim Primary School, was established in 1929. Initially in Samabula, it was later relocated to Nabua in 1986. These changes of relocation and expansions were made to cater for the growing demand in our schools, which continues, and we now own and manage twenty-two (22) educational institutions with a roll of 10,000 students.

Modern technology (Interactive Projector) is utilized to deliver teaching and learning to students and has brought about change in their educational development: aiming to produce a better educated community in years to come.

The school roll in the early days was very small compared to the present 10000 students who attend from Y-1-13, with facilities catering to all Fijian children, irrespective of religious denomination.

Apart from providing Primary and Secondary education we also offer assistance towards higher education in tertiary institutions locally, by assisting those who qualify for funding with interest free loans - since 1986.

Alhamdulillah, a significant number of Muslims have benefitted from this scheme and have successfully completed MBBS, Engineering (Electrical & Civil), Information & Technology, Nursing and many more disciplines.

Our two (2) hostels, Islamic Institute of South Pacific Girls and Boys Hostels at Nabua, Suva continue to provide full time boarding and education facility to 70 students. We were successful in sending a number of students to overseas institutions to complete their studies.

The Women's Vocational Training Centre at Makoi has been designed to provide basic skills to underprivileged ladies from all communities, so that they can earn a respectable living and work out of poverty. More than 1700 women have successfully graduated from the Centre.

The Fiji Muslim League from its humble beginnings in 1926 has made huge progress in many areas and continues to do so and we should all pay tribute to our forefathers who had toiled tirelessly to make our lives easier.

Let's pray to Almighty Allah to grant Jannatul Firdous to those who have left us and for Allah SWT's blessings upon those who are serving in various capacities in FML-Branches/ Subsidiaries. Aameen

It's my honor to contribute to the 2023 edition of Zeal. Reflecting on the year, I applaud the Principal, teachers, staff, students, and parents for their dedication to Suva Muslim College. This combined effort has cemented our college as a premier institution. Despite 2023's challenges, we've made significant strides in enhancing our facilities, supported by the Suva Branch of Fiji Muslim League and our generous donors, both local and international. Our focus has been not only on academic excellence but also on infrastructural improvements to provide the best learning environment.

Some of the key accomplishments this year include the replacement of the SMC Main Block Roof, funded jointly by Fiji Muslim League – Suva Branch and the Government's Free Education Grant. This project, totaling FJ\$95,000 is part of our commitment to a safe and conducive learning environment. This roof was changed after a period of 40 years!

We also maintained our School Wudu area roof which had begun to leak. In addition to this, the roof for the New Wing Building which houses the Computer Lab and Physics Lab was also maintained but will eventually need a wholesale change like what was done with the Main block roof. Our main priority at the end of 2023 is the upgrade of the Girls Toilet which is long overdue.

The management have always placed a strong emphasis on Islamic and Quran studies, aligning with the goals of Fiji Muslim League. We acknowledge that Islamic education is our responsibility and not government grant funded. As such, we face budget constraints every year and rely on generous donations from individuals and organizations to fund our pool of Quran teachers, which currently stands at over \$50,000 per annum.

Looking ahead, our "Adopt a Class" initiative seeks community support in maintaining and improving our facilities. This program invites contributions towards classroom upgrades, ensuring a sustained quality educational environment. With limited revenue streams, the support of donors and the community is essential in ensuring the upkeep and improvement of the school. The FML Suva Branch management encourages all interested parties to participate in the "Adopt a Class" initiative and help make a positive impact on the education of our students.

As we conclude the year, I thank everyone for their commitment and support.


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MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD BOY


One of the greatest strengths of our school has always been its ability to bring students together from various walks of life. I am proud to say that Suva Muslim College has academically raised our excelling students whom have



In 2023 academic year, the department had experienced five changes in teachers through transfer and resignations. The new teachers including two fresh graduate joined the department. There are seven hardworking teachers in the department who have worked tirelessly to either maintain or even better the internal and external examination results from last year.

Furthermore, the department offers Mathematics from YEAR 9 to YEAR 13, Life Mathematics in YEAR 11 and YEAR 12 and Physics from YEAR 11 to YEAR 13. Altogether, twenty streams are taking Mathematics and five streams are taking physics.

The department also marked the Mathematics and Physics Department week in Term 2, week 11. The activities included quiz, experiment set for Physics and display of posters and charts.

As this year unfolded, the department also took the initiative to organise other competitions for students to participate in. These included Fiji Mathematics Competition (FMC) and Team Mathematics Competition (TMC). For Team Mathematics competition, the YEAR 12 team came second in zonal, however, the team missed out the top three placing in the finals. For Fiji Mathematics Competition, sixty students sat for the competition on 21/09/23.

Finally, I wish to take this opportunity to thank the school administrators for their continuous guidance and support. A word of appreciation also goes to the management for providing the facilities for the teaching and learning process to be most effective. To my department teachers thank you for your dedication and support towards teaching and learning of Mathematics and Physics.



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


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The Urgent Need to Re look and to Enhance the Facilities of Digital Development on the Pacific Island Region.
