MESSAGE FROM THE SCHOOL MANAGER

As-Salaamu-Alaikum and Peace be Upon You,

It is my honor to contribute to the 2024 edition of Zeal. Reflecting on the year, I applaud the Principal, teachers, staff, students, and parents for their dedication to Suva Muslim College. This combined effort has cemented our college as a premier institution. Despite 2024's challenges, we've made significant strides in enhancing our facilities, supported by the Suva Branch of Fiji Muslim League and our generous donors, both local and international. Our focus has been not only on academic excellence but also on infrastructural improvements to provide the best learning environment. I am delighted to report on the major project which was successfully completed. This was the SMC Girls' washroom renovation in the original 1979 Main Block during the December 2023 to January 2024 school break. The project, costing FJ\$35,000, was entirely funded by the school's Ministry of Education – Free Education Grant.

Our main priority at the end of 2024 is the upgrade of the Boys washroom, which is long overdue. We will also assist with the project management of the SMC Student Council project.

The management committee continued the Zakaat lunch programme for needy students, illustrating our commitment to student welfare. We wish to ensure that no child gets left behind.

The management have always placed a strong emphasis on Islamic and Quran studies, aligning with the goals of Fiji Muslim League. We acknowledge that Islamic education is our responsibility and not government grant funded. As such, we face budget constraints every year and rely on generous donations from individuals and organizations to fund our pool of Quran teachers, which currently stands at over \$60,000 per annum.

Looking ahead, our "Adopt a Class" initiative seeks community support in maintaining and improving our facilities. This program invites contributions towards classroom upgrades, ensuring a sustained quality educational environment.

Some of the future projects for SMC are:

- Upgrade and Refurbishment of SMC Hardcourt
- 2. Construction of Toilet, Shower and Change Room facility to accompany the SMC Hardcourt
- 3. Upgrade and Refurbishment of SMC Boys Washroom
- 4. Repainting the whole school interior & exterior of classrooms room by room
- 5. Lower Sports Ground refurbishment and upgrade
- 6. Upgrade and Refurbishment of SMC Girls Salaat Hall







We celebrated triumphs, both big and small, Rallied together, we answered the call. In moments of struggle, we leaned on each other, Building a bond like that of a brother.


